

These 60-year-old dry-farmed vines grow on their own roots in limestone and granite sand. This wine is inspired by the *trocken* Rieslings of Germany, with Honeycrisp apple, pear and stone fruit flavors joining apricot and honey notes, the result of some lovely *Botrytis*. Orange blossom perfume lights up the aromas, and stony minerality gives it verve. Bright, snappy and totally dry, it is balanced for the table - salmon and risotto jump to mind.

Corazón is the ancestral form of my family name and means "heart" in Spanish.
