

2010 Corison Kronos Vineyard Cabernet Sauvignon



Three years of drought broke with a rainy spring in 2010. We got a late start to the season with very cool weather that delayed bud break, flowering and fruit-set by a couple of weeks. Cooler than normal summer temperatures continued into one of the coldest ripening seasons I have ever seen. At the eleventh hour a gorgeous Indian Summer set in, bringing the grapes to full ripeness.

I love the 2010 Kronos. A tiny crop of scraggly clusters with tiny berries resulted in a wine of uncommon depth and concentration. Complex plum and boysenberry fruit play with baking spices, peppermint, cocoa and dusty mineral grace notes on the palate. Every so often I catch an elusive whiff of Daphne; the characteristic Kronos Vineyard floral perfume is already emerging.

97 Cathy Corison's 2010 Cabernet Sauvignon Kronos Vineyard is one of the most surprising wines in this tasting, as I did not expect it to be so open and expressive. Made from diseased, head-trained vines just behind Corison's barn-like winery, the 2010 Kronos, is deep, savory and wonderfully expressive, with fabulous concentration and tons of depth.

With air, some of the signature floral/savory/mineral notes come forward. Violets, lavender, graphite, licorice and blue/purplish fruits abound in a classically structured, pedigreed Cabernet Sauvignon of the highest level. The good news is the 2010 won't take as long to open up as I had initially thought.

97 The 2010 Kronos Cabernet Sauvignon is one of the most striking, hauntingly beautiful wines I have ever tasted from Cathy Corison. 95 🌸🌸🌸 In this wine, Corison offers an exceptional combination of exuberant fruit, admirable depth, layers of curranty, cherryish and roasted vanilla flavors and nicely mannered tannins. To say that the wine is tasty without being bold is to miss the point. Its flavors go on and on, and they build through the finish, yet there is not a

hint of excess at any stop, and the wine is sure to age on its balance, complexity and underlying firmness rather than on the basis of large and palate-challenging muscularity. We know that the top Cabernets can last up to twenty years. This is such a wine.

94 - Top Scoring Wine - Strong cassis-violet & graphite bouquet, with lovely floral accents... Polished, refined tannins back quite fresh, pretty cabernet fruit. Elegant, with good acidity and deliciously long finish. Black and blue fruits; remarkably fresh; crunchy, dry, good acid;

firm, restrained but plenty of concentration; built for the long haul. The 2010 Kronos Vineyard from Corison has a wonderfully expressive blackberry fruit with a floral, violet edge. On the palate the wine is vibrant and intense. It is dense but not heavy, balanced and very elegant. With plenty of grip and freshness, it is a wonderful wine with a great future ahead of it.

17.5 Black core moving to ruby around the edges. Star bright in the glass. Deep and intriguing aromatics showing hints of blooming roses, black cherry, dried ruby-red grapefruit and dark cocoa powder. Uniquely perfumed from the nose through the palate. Mixed fruits here with notes of blue and black crisp berries and mixed citrus elements with just a hint of pomegranate. Fine-grained tannin and mouth-watering acidity carry into a long finish. Lovely finesse, elegance and exotic elements all touched by the classic gunpowder, iron accent native to the site. Delicious.

17.5 30-year-old vines on St George rootstock. Mid purplish crimson. Complex, non-flashy nose with aromatic herbs and real savour and attack. Nothing pushy here. Super appetising. Much more convincing natural acidity than most. *Jancis Robinson, 30 October 2014*

93 Medium-dark ruby with purplish tinges; attractive, forward, perfumed, deep, complex, blue and black fruit aroma with hints of cassis, dried herbs, and cocoa; full body; forward, rich, elegant, well balanced, complex, currant, dark cherry, and blackberry flavors with good depth and structure; full tannin; lingering aftertaste. 92-95 From the first sniff, sip and swirl, I fell in love with this wine genuine; suffused with notes of earth and herb, the nose melds black currants and blueberries that are layered upon violets and toasty oak. The palate is taut, energetic and exciting. The fruit core is intensely focused, integrating layers of acai and blueberry/boysenberry and blackcurrant/cherry in a stream of sensory stimulation. The dark fruit core is pierced by acidity, lifting them to reveal plum skin, hints of bitter chocolate, spice and espresso. In a world filled with modernly styled CA Cabernets high in fruit and alcohol and low in acid, Cathy produces elegantly, restrained and yet stunning and fiercely addictive wines. Resounding black cherry and perfumed floral notes fully capture the nose with this complex, deeply structured, energetic Cabernet Sauvignon. Layer upon layer of blackberry, cassis, spiced plum, tobacco and a touch of earthy minerality converge and flow in harmony across the palate. This gem engages the senses completely through the memorable finish.
