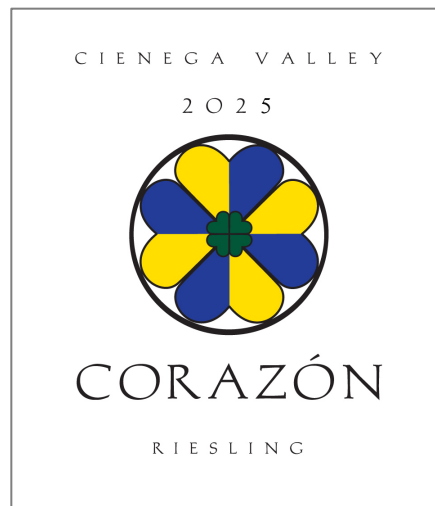




These rare, 60+ year-old dry-farmed vines grow on their own roots in limestone and granite sand in the historic Cienega Valley near Hollister. Floral notes of honeysuckle combine with green apple, white peach and tart nectarine flavors. Mineral and saline nuance adds complexity, while tart natural acidity brings freshness and lift. The bright, snappy acidity and dry finish make it especially versatile with food.

Corazón is the ancestral form of our family name and means "heart" in Spanish.
